The prerequisites for BMKT 365 – Marketing Strategies and Decisions are being revised to "45 credits of 100-level or higher coursework; or 6 NABU credits." The removal of the specific course prerequisite and the addition of credit hour prerequisites will open this course to students from other disciplines as part of the proposed Minor in Business Administration.

Cap Core designation under the heading *Experiential* was also requested for both BMKT 261 – Advertising and BMKT 365 – Marketing Strategies & Decisions.

The School of Business is proposing a cognate Minor in Business Administration, which will be available to all Capilano University Bachelor's degree students beginning in Fall 2021. A minimum 18 credits will be required to achieve the Minor in Business Administration, comprised of 3 lower level credits and 15 upper level credits.

A Minor in Business Administration will enhance a wide range of Capilano University baccalaureate programs and expand opportunities for student success. Students in the minor will gain a basic understanding of four core areas of business (accounting, marketing, business law, and human resources), which will increase their attractiveness to potential employers.
