INTE 215 Advanced Interactive Vector Graphics and INTE 216 Portfolio & Presentation Skills are two new courses that were developed in order to keep up with emerging technologies. These two courses replace INTE 210 and INTE 212 on both the Diploma in the Interactive Design Program profile and on the Certificate in the Advanced Interactive Design Program profile.
