BMKT 161 – Marketing

Members were advised that the two courses, MUS 109 Music Theory for Non-Music Majors and SOSC 330 Research Methods and Statistics in the Social Sciences had requested certification as quantitative/analytical. A process was previously put in place to grant this certification in which a sub-committee of SCC, chaired by the chair of SCC would convene and assess the courses. Along with Robert Campbell, Jennifer Moore, Vineet Johnson and Milton Williams volunteered to serve on this sub-committee.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Discussion Item #1 - Grading Profile Update Process

Members were reminded that Senate previously approved a single grading profile for the University, effective Fall 2013. It was reported that, after discussions with Deans, the recommendation was that courses effective Fall 2013 would have the new grading profile attached, and no further approval process was necessary. If areas wished to have the new grading profile on courses prior to Fall 2013, the regular approval process, including SCC, would be required. As well, the grading profile committee continues to work on the qualitative version of grades and once determined, the recommendation will be brought to Senate.

Discussion Item #2 – Course Outline Review at SCC

Members discussed the time spent at SCC on general review of course outlines with respect to punctuation, grammar and typographical errors, and the need for consistency within all course outlines. Members discussed the possibility of engaging copy editing services in order to free up time at SCC and Robert will explore this option.
