SCC was requested to approve revisions to the Business and Culture for Foreign-trained Professionals program profile. On review of the program profile, members expressed concern with some of the guidelines for selecting students and of the resulting perceived implications of the guidelines to the University. As a result of the discussion, revisions were requested to the program profile. As the program is scheduled to start July 8 and Senate and SCC do not meet until August, a recommendation was put forth to convene the Fast Track Approval Committee for a one-time approval of the proposal with revisions.
