#### 9. BUSINESS ITEMS

(a) First Year Seminar Courses – Operational Flowchart

At the October 19<sup>th</sup>, 2018 Senate Curriculum Committee meeting, the VP Academic and Provost was requested to provide an operational flowchart on the process for development and approval for new sections of the First Year Seminar courses.

It was noted that additional refinements could occur over the next several months as a result of ongoing review of the process. The goal is to ensure that there is appropriate academic oversight to maintain adherence to the approved course outlines as well as approaches consistent with the first year seminars pedagogy.

On review and discussion of the proposed process, concerns were again raised with regard to the vetting process at the Faculty level of courses that are developed and whether these new courses are aligning with Cap Core requirements.

SCC was informed that the process being proposed is similar to that currently used at other institutions in terms of form, call out and committee. It was suggested that to ensure a further level of comfort, to reach out to these institutions for information on how they have been navigating the process.

There being no further business, and on a motion duly made and seconded, the meeting was adjourned at 12:50 at pm.
