ECCE has proposed to change the course numbering for EDUC 348 and EDUC 354 to EDUC 282 and EDUC 284 respectively. As a result of the renumbering of these courses, the prerequisites for EDUC 349 and EDUC 390 are also being revised.

The proposed changes to the course outlines and resulting revisions to the program profiles are the result of consultation with the Early Childhood Care and Education program's diploma committee with the intention to respond to changes within the field, to support students transferring into the program from other institutions, and to support students should they choose to apply to the ECCE degree program upon completion of the ECCE diploma program.

On review of the EDUCE 349 and EDUC 390 course outlines, a suggestion was presented that the department may wish to consider moving the information from the course format to the course note or calendar description.
