Bachelor of Arts - Applied Behaviour Analysis (Autism) – Program Profile Applied Behaviour Analysis (Autism) Post Baccalaureate Diploma – Program Profile

The Bachelor of Arts – Applied Behaviour Analysis (Autism) program profile is being revised to remove ABA 443 as an ABA elective and make it a required course and to remove Psych 201 Group Dynamics and replace it with a "300 or 400 level elective".

The ABA Post Baccalaureate Diploma in Applied Behaviour Analysis – Autism program profile is being revised to remove Psych 201 Group Dynamics from the Post Baccalaureate program and replace it with the existing ABA 443 course. This change will keep the number of credits in the Post-Bac Diploma consistent at 45 credits and allow a more balanced course load across semesters.
