- Develop community-based projects in a collaborative way
- Collaboratively create tangible project deliverables such as a program guide, in-depth proposals, social media material etc
- Prepare and make a professional presentation

Weekly seminars will be held on the following themes:

- Finding and developing research questions
- Writing a literature review
- Themes targeted to student interests such as Food Security, Health Promotion etc
- Finding and developing collaborative relationship with project partners

- Time management
- Presentation skills

In addition to class-time learning, students will participate in on-line activities and work on group or individual research projects.
