DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I am a nerd. For most of my life I have found escape and solice in the fantasy and science fiction movies of my childhood. Through them I learned about tolerance, respect, teamwork and that standing up for your beliefs and those of others is an act of heroism. I learned that no matter what realm, world or galaxy you are from, fear can destroy us or make us stronger. I learned that understanding often de-escalates catastrophic conflict. And in more recent times I have yearned for an escape back to my safe space – a galaxy far far away.

Since I have become an adult, I have found that nerd and geek culture has become much more acceptable and mainstream than it was during my formative years. I thought my Dungeon and Dragon days were over when I entered adulthood.

I was sure wrong.

Popular films and series such as *Stranger Things, Onward, Mythic Quest,* and *Big Bang Theory* strongly suggest that geek culture and nerdom is here to stay. And that makes me happy. So happy. Now, about the play...

She Kills Monsters is a comedic drama and fantasy play written by Qui Nguyen, playwright, TV/film writer, and co-Founder of the OBIE Award-winning Vampire Cowboys Theatre Company of NYC. His work, known for its innovative use of pop-culture, stage violence, puppetry, and multimedia, has been called "culturally savvy comedy," by The New York Times, "tour de force theatre," by Time Out New York, and "infectiousvfun" by Variety.

The play is the story of a young woman, Agnes, coping with the aftermath of losing her immediate family in a car crash. Having been very distant from her sister while she was alive, Agnes embarks in a Dungeons and Dragons module written by her young sister, Tilly, and discovers things she'd never imagined.

This play is an important modern work of literature in that it presents a fresh and powerful look at LGBTQ characters without marginalizing them. Monsters, adventure, love and identity culminate in a play that is refreshing, fun, and brings depth to the nerd in all of us.

ARTISTIC TEAM BIOS

Nicholas Harrison-Director

Nicholas Harrison was trained as an actor in London, England, has a Masters in Directing from the University of Victoria and a PhD from the University of British Columbia. Harrison is a member of the Playwrights Guild of Canada.

He is an award-winning actor and has written a book about the origins of stage combat in Canada and continues to choreo-



graph violence for film, television and theatre all over the world. His book, *Safe Space: The True Story of Faith, Betrayal and the Power of the Force*, is scheduled for publication this November. At present he teaches theatre and film at Capilano University, stages violence for various companies including Vancouver Opera and in his spare time he likes to raise money for various charities through his work with the 501st and Rebel Legions. He lives with his daughter in the traditional territory of the Tsawwassen and Musqueam First Nations who have been stewards of this land since time immemorial. 


Jordan Rempel- Chuck


Emily Makudi - Lillith/Lilly
